Partners in Finance Worksheet

Use this worksheet by yourself or with your caseworker, a member of your legal team, or a mentor to help you prepare to have a conversation about financial decision-making with your foster parent or group home staff

Answer the following questions to help you get clear on what matters most to you:

1. What do I want most when it comes to spending money for my child? (For example, I want to buy clothes for my child, I want a specific brand of diaper, or I want to have a say over what my child eats)

2. What am I willing to compromise on? (For example, I'm OK if my foster parents do the shopping, as long as they consult with me first)

3. What do I want to learn about money management? (For example, I want to understand how my foster parent budgets the stipend for my child so that I can eventually do it myself)

You might also want to ask your foster parent or group home staff some questions to find out what matters most to them. You might ask:

1. Can you explain how you budget the money for my child?

2. What steps do you take to make sure the money covers all my child's needs?

Once you have that information, try to answer the questions below:

1. What is most important to my foster parent or group home staff when it comes to budgeting money for my child?

2. How can I ask for what I want while also making clear to my foster parent or group home staff that I respect what's most important to them?
